Welcome and Introductions

Vivian Firestone welcomed DELAC members.

Approval of Minutes from October 18, 2018

Upon motion by Ilse te Boome, seconded by Sara Chang, the minutes from October 18, 2018 were unanimously approved.

Importance of Regular School Attendance

Vivian Firestone presented on attendance. A student who has been absent 10 percent or more of the school days is classified as chronically absent. We have 180 school days, if a student is absent 18 days or more, that student is chronically absent. Chronic absenteeism can have negative long-term impact on a student's academic progress.

Chronic absenteeism is monitored by the state and reported on the California school dashboard.

Independent Study contracts are available for when students must be out of school for five days or more. As long as all assigned work is returned completed, absences are excused and do not count towards chronic absenteeism.

Review of Plan to Ensure Compliance with Any Teacher Requirements

Every district is required to have teachers who are credentialed to teach English learners. In DMUSD, all teachers are credentialed with CLAD. CLAD is the California English Learner Authorization and Cross-cultural, Language and Academic Development Certificate. DMUSD does not hire teachers unless they have CLAD. DMUSD is continuously training teachers to meet the needs of all students including English learners, and those students who have been

reclassified as fluent English speaking.

DMUSD has adopted an ELD program Wonders and is involved with on-going training for classroom teachers to address language acquisition skills using those materials.

DMUSD has also just purchased a software tool called Ellevation, which will allow us to digitize the entire process for reclassifying students and monitoring the progress of students who have been already been reclassified. RFEP students are monitored for 4 years after being reclassified. This tool will provide easier access to important information helpful for supporting students.

Roundtable

The question was asked how do parents know what supports are available to their students? English Learner parents should talk to their principal. Each school has different resources to help students.
