YOU JUST RECEIVED AN ASSESSMENT PLAN - WHAT'S NEXT?

Eligibility IEP Meeting

You will be invited to meet with your child's special education assessment team to determine if your child is eligible for special education services.

STEP 1

Within 60-day of receiving your consent to assess

STEP 2

If eligible for special education

IEP Development

The IEP team will develop an IEP for your child based upon your child's identified areas of need.

IEP Implementation

IEPs are implemented as written based on each child's identified areas of need.

STEP 3

Upon written parental consent

STEP 4

Once per trimester as well as annually

Progress on Goals

Service providers provide you with your child's current level of functioning throughout the school year.

Eligibility for ESY

Extended school year services are offered to eligible students based on regression and recoupment data.

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STEP 5

Determined annually

STEP 6

Offered over summer break

Extended School Year

If your child is eligible for ESY, they will be provided with specially designed instruction in identified areas of need.

Summer Vacation

Service providers are unavailable during the summer. If you have immediate needs, please contact the District Office

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STEP 7

STEP 8

Annually

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Plan Review

Your child's IEP team will review your child's PLAAFP, progress on goals, proposed new goals and annual offer of FAPE.

Additional IEP Meetings

Your child's school-based IEP team may offer additional IEP meetings. You may also request an IEP meeting at any time

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STEP 9

Within 30-days of parent request

STEP 10

As often as once every three-years

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Eligibility Review

Your child's IEP team will reevaluate your child to determine continued eligibility for special education supports and services.

Transition Supports

Your child's IEP team will outline recommended middle school transition support at an IEP meeting during your child's 6th-grade year. If your child receives SAI services, SDUHSD will be invited to attend your child's transition meeting.

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STEP 11

Occurs during your child's 6th grade year.
