HEALTH AND SAFETY PROTOCOLS

The safety of our students and staff continues to be our highest priority. The District's Health and Safety Plan for the 2021-2022 school year is based on guidance and requirements issued by the California Department of Public Health. The foundational principle of that guidance is that all students have access to safe in-person instruction. Our protocols include layered mitigation strategies that reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19 and ensure that our schools are safe so that students can stay healthy and remain in school.

The District's health and safety protocols include masking for all students indoors, stable groupings, increased ventilation and hand hygiene. As an alternative learning option, students whose health is at risk due to a medical concern related to COVID-19 may enroll in independent study.

The District continues to consult with local and state health officials regarding safety protocols in the case of a confirmed positive case of COVID-19. The DMUSD health protocols will be updated as needed based on state guidelines and requirements.

FACILITIES

The Del Mar Heights School Rebuild project continues to make progress in moving through the process of addressing the litigation brought by a small group of community members and completing the permitting process in order to begin construction.

Pacific Sky School, the District's newest school in Pacific Highlands Ranch, is under construction and scheduled to open for students on August 15, 2022.

Planning for the District's next major project, the modernization of Del Mar Hills Academy, is under way. District staff have been gathering input from the students, staff, and community and working with architects to develop a plan that will then be brought to the Board of Trustees.

Across the district, additional projects are being completed that modernize classrooms, improve play areas, and upgrade fields with a focus on bringing an impact to our students as quickly as possible.
